Summary of Call #2

CECAC Process

1. Develop initial GHG inventories and forecasts
2. Identify possible GHG mitigation options
3. Identify initial priorities for first round evaluation
4. Evaluate GHG reduction potential, cost effectiveness, additional issues
5. Identify potential barriers to consensus, alternatives
6. Modify, add or subtract mitigation options as needed
7. Evaluate cumulative results of mitigation options
8. Iterate to consensus with new alternatives, with votes as needed
9. Aggregate options into implementation scenarios
10. Finalize recommendations and report language

TWG Next Steps

- Identify priority policy options from catalog
 - Rank and screen options as needed
 - Suggest initial “priorities for analysis” to the CECAC
- Analysis of top priorities

TLU Inventory and Forecast

Balloting Process

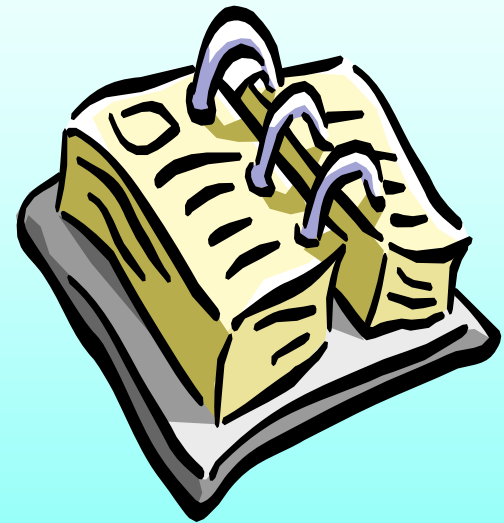
- Prioritize policies for analysis
- Option of bundling policies
- Rank into high, medium and low priorities for analysis
- Quantification by CCs and TWG for high priorities, address remainder as time and resources allow.

Balloting Process

- Each TWG member has 10 votes.
- You may bundle policy options together into a single bundle, on which you use one vote. For example, if you think that all of the TLU 2.1 options (2.1.1-8) should be a single policy option bundle, you may say that and use one vote to vote for that bundle
- Return your votes by e-mail to CCS
- The preferred form is to return a list of 10 priority policies (including any bundles) - be sure to give the policy #s.
- You can also vote using the policy catalog itself, putting an “X” in the “Priority for Analysis” column. Put any bundling requests in the “Notes” column. Then save the catalog with a file name indicating it is yours
